Temporary RV Park/Campground in Coordination with an Event

The following guidelines are designed to prevent any sanitation, public health and environmental health disruptions. Prompt cleanup is critical to preventing any follow up action or Notices of Violation.

- If no central bath house is available: portable toilets are recommended to be placed at a rate of 10 per 100 campsites. It is best to distribute these throughout the area. Portable hand wash stations are also encouraged if available.
- A fresh, potable water source should be available.
- Shower water/sink water/sewer water must be disposed of in an approved manner including a licensed sewage pumper, dump station, city/county sewer, or approved septic system. Notices will be issued and forwarded to the local county attorney for any violations.
- Pumper contract/agreement should be secured with a Kentucky permitted sewage hauler. A list of licensed pumpers in the area can be provided upon request. The owner of the camping area is not necessarily responsible for payment – pumper may charge per camper at his own discretion.
- Sites should be flagged/marked in some manner and numbered systematically. When your area is full of campers and tents, will an ambulance be able to pick out site 34 quickly? A map, even hand drawn, can be very useful when parking vehicles and during an emergency.
- 1500 square feet is the recommended minimum site size. This may be in any dimension, but typically gives plenty clearance for slide outs, etc.
- Dumpster and/or covered containers should be available for patrons. Trailers may be used to collect garbage and haul away, but must be removed every day.
- Contact information: It's a good idea to have your information available for patrons during the event. A sign is often used with the name of the facility and owner contact. This is also helpful for campers to find space to rent from you.

NOTE: This is not an approval for a year round camping facility. RV Campgrounds are permitted for year round use. This document is only a guide for those temporary areas that may set up camping type facilities in coordination with a large scale event in the area.

***** Temporary food booths must be permitted by the Health Department. Please contact your locate Health Department for permit and guidelines for inspection.**
